Continuous Internal Assessment System

Reforms in Continuous internal assessment (CIA) system

- 1. As an important task and productive educational strategy, our college adopts this CIA system for valuing all components and aspects of growth and development of students on a continuous basis throughout the academic year.
- 2. For all taught courses, the ratio of Continuous Internal Assessment (CIA) component to Semester End Assessment (SEA) is 40:60. This relatively high weightage compels students to engage in learning process throughout the duration of the course.
- 3. Since 2020-2021 academic year Continuous Internal Assessment (CIA) is done by concerned faculty during the semester. Students' learning in knowledge, skills, aptitude, imagination. The share of CIA is 40 out of 100. Continuous internal assessment (CIA) reforms are progressive. CIA for 40 marks. Two Internal Examinations will be conducted for 25 marks and taken best of one as final Internal Marks.
- 4. In addition to that Assignment carries -5 marks, Seminar carries 5 marks, Extra Curricular activities carries 5 marks.
- 5. The End Semester Examinations will be conducted for 60 marks.
- 6. From 2022-2023 academic year Continuous Internal Assessment (CIA) was changed as Two Internal Examinations will be conducted for 25 marks and taken best of one as final Internal Marks.
- 7. In addition to that Assignment carries -5 marks, Seminar carries 5 marks, Extra Curricular activities carries 5 marks.
- 8. For first semester students from 2022-2023 CIA changed. Two Internal Examinations will be conducted for 20 marks and 15 marks. In addition to that Assignment carries -5 marks, Seminar carries 5 marks, Extra Curricular activities carries 5 marks. Now total 50 marks scale down to 40 marks.
- 9. The Office of the Controller of Examinations prepares a calendar for CIA examinations. The portal for entry of marks of each component is opened on the basis of this calendar only for a specified duration. This process prompts the faculty to complete the valuation of each CIA component without delay which facilitates quick feedback to students.

Reforms on examination procedures and processes

- 1. CBCS was introduced into the curriculum from 2014-2015.
- 2. The results have been declared in a span of 20 days so that students are not losing professional and career opportunities.
