

1. Brief history of the College

Government College for Men, Kadapa was established in 1948 is one of the oldest prestigious institutions in Rayalaseema area of Southern Andhra Pradesh. The college is popularly known to the people of Kadapa district as Government Arts College and it was renamed later as Govt. College for Men. As the college is completed 75 years of its yeoman service to the noble cause of education, it is appropriate to look back at its beginning and growth and its contribution to the people of Kadapa district in particular and to the country in general over the period of 7 decades.

The district of Kadapa had been without a college for many years. The then government of the composite Madras state announced that it was its policy to start one college in every district headquarters. The citizens of Kadapa promptly co-operated with the Government in making it possible to start the college in 1948 in the locally available District Board Buildings or Zillaparishad Buildings.

A college committee was formed with late Sri. N. Ranga Reddy, a leading advocate of Kadapa town, as President, Sri. Jagirdar Ramachandra Rao., B.A., B.L., as Secretary and Sri. T.M. Seshadri., B.A., B.L., as the Treasurer to raise funds for the construction of the college Hostel Building. Sri. Mohammed Ismail Sahib, District Educational Officer at the time, Sri. R.S. Malayappan, B.A., the then District Collector and late Sri. B. Madhava Rao Naidu, played an active and vital role in making the District Board building available to the college committee for housing the proposed college and finding a suitable site of nearly 50 acres near the Railway station for the construction of permanent building for the college.

The college went to NAAC 3rd cycle in 2019 received B-grade. Then, the IQAC and management strived to establish, Insstitutional Strategic plan, systems and policies to develope the college in all aspects. Now the college is flousished in all aspects like academic, administration, student services and research due to the commitment leadership, participative management, e-governance etc. 80% of last NAAC

recommendations were fulfilled except Hostel for students and Startups due to lack of funds.

Ambedkar Open University as well acting as **Nodal Resource Center** to train the faculty of Govt. and Pvt. Aided Degree Colleges in Kadapa Dist.

9. Faculty Achievements

- Out of 82 faculty members, 44 are **Doctorates**.
- To its credit, the teaching staff of the college have received 18 State Best Teacher
 Awards so far. 2 faculty members and 22 students have received prestigious
 "Pratibha awards" from Govt. of AP.
- To our credit, 7 faculty members have been acting as **Master Trainers**, 12 members as **LMS Content Generators** as well 8 members acting as **Subject Experts**.
- Yet another milestone is the college has been recognized as "Research Center" and 13 faculty members have been provided "Guideship" to accelerate the research.

10. Infrastructure Development

- A "Central Research Lab" and "Material Science Lab" have been established to pursue the research not only for stakeholders but also faculty.
- A "Skill Development Center" is under construction with the worth of 70 Lakhs,
 which was sanctioned by Hon'ble former Railway minister Sri Suresh Prabhu
 (Rajya Subha) under MP lads for construction of rooms and digital equipment.
- In 2020-21, under **NIRF** an amount of **3.35 crs** was sanctioned for construction of class rooms, renovation and laboratory equipment.
- In 2021-22, the **Hon'ble District Collector** has sanctioned **75 lakhs** under CSR funds for construction of new compound wall and **800m track** in the ground and also **10 lakhs** for erection of **flood lights**.
- Further, the **Hon'ble District Collector** sanctioned **1.8 crs** to enable the stagnated rain water in the college to flow through the **culvert**.
- Hon'ble Member of Parliament of Kadapa Sri Y.S Avinash Reddy garu has sanctioned worth of 5 lakhs Sports Equipment to encourage the students to actively participate in sports and games.

 The college recognised as DBT Star College Scheme and sanctioned 125 Crore rupees

13. COs, POs and its relevance:

 The college has meticulously drawn POs in general and PSOs in specific for each program offered and these are designed in line with the UN SDGs. The institution has offered 18-UG programs, 2-PG programs under the CBCS.

14. **Programs for employability:**

 The institution in tune with its vision, is offering skill/employability courses embedded with Life Skill Courses, Skill Development Courses and Certificate Courses. Syllabus revision is done according to the needs of the programme every year through BOS.

17.Cross-cutting Issues:

• The college integrated courses with cross-cutting issues-13 such as Human Values, Professional Ethics, Environmental Studies, Environmental Education,

Health and Hygiene, Environment Audit, Personality Development and Leadership, Leadership Education, Entrepreneurship Education, ICT, Communication and Soft Skills, Plant Nursery, Electrical Appliances, Indian Culture and Science, Insurance Promotion, Solar Energy into the curriculum as a compulsory course with two credits. The curriculum of courses with cross cutting issues is designed in line with UNSDGs and NEP–2020. The mapping of course content and its related SDGs are done during curriculum design.

18.Feedback:

 The IQAC is responsible for collecting the feedbacks from students, teachers, parents, alumni and employers. Feedbacks are analysed and the action taken report is placed before Staff Council and Academic Council meetings for approval.

19. Special Programs:

• The institution devises appropriate teaching-learning strategies based on their learning capabilities such Bridge Course-First Semester Students, Remedial coaching, Material Support, Counselling support, Peer Group Learning-Slow learners, Study projects and creative assignments-Moderate Learners, Coaching for CUET, live projects, Online Courses-Advanced Learners, Coaching for Competitive Exams, Field Visits, Career Guidance-All Students.

20.Student centric methods:

23. Research facilities:

 College has Central Research Lab, Material Science Lab, N-List, Central Library, 300mbps & 100mbps speed internet. The college has 16-laboratories, Zoology Museum, Botany Museum, Geology Museum and Botanical Graden to do research work.

24. R&D Cell

R&D Cell is constituted to promote and monitor the ethics of research through a
well framed Research promotion policy and code of ethics. In addition to
that Research Advisory Committee, Research fund mobilization committee,
IPRs committee, research ethics committee etc., were constituted.

25. Research Guideship:

• There are 44-Ph.D teachers actively involved in research. 13-teachers recognized as **Guides**. **17-scholars have registered**

26.Innovation Ecosystem:

 The college is recognised as Research Centre by YVU, MOUs-43 for Collaborative Research, Innovation Cell is established to promote innovations in research.

27.Research Promotion:

• **Faculty** received **financial assistance** for promotion of research.

28. Research Publication:

• The faculty **published 30-research publications** in UGC Care listed/Scopus/Web of Science Journals and also published **25-books**

29.Extension Activities:

• The college has institutionalized its extension services undertaken by NSS, NCC, RRC, WEC, Consumer Club and Eco Club to inculcate social and humanistic values among students. College established MOUs-6 for collaborative extension activities. Students who were actively involved in social service are enhanced their leadership qualities, communication skills, team work skills, humanity, empathy, and excelled in their academics. Extension and outreach programs were conducted few activities are Blood Donation, Covid Vaccination, Socio-economic surveys, medical camps, cleaning the streets, plantation of saplings, Health & Hygiene Campaigns etc.

33. IT Policy:

39. Grievance & redressal Cell:

- The college has policies on Grievance & redressal, Anti ragging.
- The Grievance & redressal Cell taking care of timely redressal of the grievances received and no incidence of sexual harassment and ragging were received.
- A transparent grievance redressal system i.e., online grievance (CE-GRaM) and offline grievances (Complaint Box) is in place which functions effectively.

40. Placement Cell:

• Jawahar Knowledge Centre (JKC) was established (2004) to provide employability skills to the students with fee of Rs 500/-.

41. Student Council:

- The college has Student Council policy.
- Student Council helps in coordinating all the events like cultural, recreational, sports, College Day Celebrations etc.
- Students are represented in the various committees such as IQAC, cultural, sports,
 Magazine Preparation, Anti-ragging Committee etc.

• The college conducted 1-Sports competitions, 1-Cultural competitions, 30-Academic competitions, and 5- activities through Active clubs.

43. Alumni Association:

• The new Alumni Association of Government College for Men (A), Kadapa' got registered with registration number of 515 of 2022.

- Alumni involved in BOS, Academic Council, GB and other academic and administrative committees.
- They also sponsor endowment prizes, and support academic activities.
- College maintains the alumni database through Dashboard.
